VICTIMS RIGHTS WORKING GROUP

DEFINITION OF A VICTIM

As a minimum, the Victims Rights Working Group proposes the following definition of victim to apply for all purposes. The definition was unanimously adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in the Declaration of Basic Principles of Justice for Victims of Crime and Abuse of Power in 1985 (GA/RES/40/34).

'Victims' means persons who, individually or collectively, have suffered harm, including physical or mental injury, emotional suffering, economic loss or substantial impairment of their fundamental rights, as a result of acts or omissions that constitute crimes within the jurisdiction of the Court. The term 'victim' also includes, where appropriate, the immediate family or dependants of the direct victim and persons who have suffered harm in intervening to assist victims in distress or to prevent victimization.¹
