REVIEW AND RECOMMENDATIONS

TRIAL DATA: The accused was tried at Dachau, Germany, on 4 June 1947, I. a General Military Government Court.

II. CHARGE AND PARTICULARS:

CHARGE: Violation of the Laws and Usages of War

PARTICULARS: In that Johann GROSS, a Gorman national, did, at or near ALTHIED, Garmany, in or about the month of January or February 1945, deliberately and wrongfully encourage, aid, abet and participate in the killing of an unknown member of the United States Army, who was then end there an unermed and surrendered prisoner of war in the custody of the then German Roich.

III. SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE: In January or February 1945 a surrendered and unarmed American flier was being removed by foot from confinement in Rogensdorf, Germany, to the Cestapo office in Altwied, Germany, some three and one-half kilometers distant. He was in the custody of accused GROSS and another Gestapo man. The flier was marched into a nearby wood and shot to death. Accused GROSS admitted firing some shots but claimed they were warning shots fired because the flier was attempting to escape. GROSS contended the fatal shots were fired by his Gestapo companion.

Evidence for Prosecution: Witness Muscheid testified that at 2200 hours one night in Fobruary 1945 an American flior was brought to the office of the Mayor of Regensdorf, Germany, who re witness worked; that witness propered a receipt for the personal effects of the flier; that witness assisted the flior who had a badly swellen leg in his walk from the Mayor's office to the place where the flior was locked up for the night; and that the next morning he saw the flier being taken from the place of confinement by two Cestapo men who proceeded toward the town of Altwicd where a Gestapo office was located (R 8-19). Witness Rauschenbarger testified to seeing a limping American flier and two Gostapo men who were going toward Altwied turn into a woods and to hearing two shots a short time leter (R 19-23). Witness Kuchbacher testified that GROSS and another Gustapo man were sent from the Gestapo Hondquarters to get a flier at Regensdorf, and that they later returned without the flier, the witness being told that they had had to shoot the flier; Kuchbacher further testified that the Gestapo men with GROSS was seen wearing an American flior's jacket and witness was told the flior had been required to remove the jacket before the shooting so as not to got holes in it (R 23-30). Withous Ruppert testified that GROSS and the other Gesti po man took a burial detail of Russian prisoners toward the woods between Regensdorf and Altwied, and that witness later saw a Russian wearing American boots which the Russian stated had been removed from a flier (R 30-40). GROSS, in an extradjudicial sworn statement, admitted firing shots at the flier and by his testimony in Court he admitted firing warning shots at the flier and that the flier was killed while he and the other Gestapo man were conducting him to Altwied (R 43, 45, 7; P-Ex 2a).

Evidence for Defense: GROSS, in sworn testimony, denied that he knew about the injured foot cothe flier (R 42); that accused fired random warning shots, which did out hit the flier; that shots were fired because the flier tried to escape; that the other Gestape man fired the

shots which killed the flier (R 43); that he (GROSS) carried the flier's jacket from the police station (R 54). In said extrajudicial sworn statement, GROSS stated the flier attempted to escape into the woods during what appeared to be an imminent air attack, and that he would not have fired had not the flier tried to escape (R 7; P-Ex 2a).

Sufficiency of Evidence: It is improbable that the injured victim would have tried to escape to woods 200 feet distant, while being followed by two men with machine pistels. The findings of guilty are warranted by the evidence. The sentence is not excessive.

Potitions: No Potit ions for Esview nor Potitions for Clomency were filed.

Recommendation: That the findings and sentence be approved.

V. QUESTIONS OF LAW:

Jurisdiction: It is clear that the Court had jurisdiction of the person of the accused and of the subject matter.

Examination of the entire record fails to disclose any error or omission which resulted in injustice to the accused.

VI. CONCLUSIONS:

- 1. It is recommended that the findings and the sentence be approved.
- 2. Legal Forms Nos. 13 and 16 to accomplish this result are attoched hereto, should it most with approve 1.
